

Director's Notes

It's hard to believe that this is Trinity's eighth pantomime since we revived the tradition in 2010 and we have chosen Sleeping Beauty – a classic pantomime and one we had to do as we had a lot of pressure (and I mean a lot!) from our young, female cast members.

It's also hard to believe that when we started doing pantomimes we had about 4 children taking part (all too young to do lines), used painted wooden flats that a tall man had to spin by hand to change scenes and did lots of scenes in front of bright orange curtains. Now we have 22 children (almost all with speaking parts), drop cloths from the ceiling and two painted front curtains.

As usual the back room gang – led by the intrepid Neil Barham and stalwart Jim Parkinson - have risen to the challenge and we are extending our effects by introducing a Gauze to create a more wistful and romantic tone to this story. Painters and prop makers Phil Michelangelo Johnson, Malcolm Timepiece Afferson, Alex Warhol Bostock, Ian Picasso Harley and Graham Woodchopper Myers have excelled themselves yet again.

You will notice the continued inclusion of SONGS in the show as we have hunted for and secured some young and promising actor/singers. Probably our biggest change this year is the range of dances featuring a number of new, young cast members who have been schooled and cajoled by the extremely hard working and talented choreographer Joe Battye. Joe has even attempted to get some of our old stagers to dance – just watch for the moves by the twinkle-toed Nick Percival.

It is yet again the traditional tale of love transcending all obstacles – including the princess being a hundred years older than her lover!

We've tried to keep faith with the original ideas of a simple community based family Panto and we are prepared to try and include anyone who wants to have a go. I tender my apologies to Christine and Michael Goodwin for some of the torturous re-writes.

Please feel free to join in with all of the audience participation sections and make this as pleasurable an experience as it has been for the cast and crew who have been working hard for some weeks.

For me the highlights to look out for are the Gauze songs, the schooling scene, the finale and the behind the scenes team comedy number! Enjoy it – and if you do, please feel free to tell others that we are on over two weekends – otherwise, say nowt!
